The Leader-on-Loan program offers branches the opportunity to have a state leader as a program speaker or for other branch support. AAUW-PA will cover the leader’s transportation costs (as funds are available). The host branch is responsible for any meals and overnight accommodations.

Through Leader on Loan, your branch may request one (1) visit per year from an AAUW-PA leader to present a branch program or workshop, board orientation, or community-based event. Please check <http://aauwpa.org/program.htm>, for additional speakers and topics.

When requesting a Leader on Loan, use the application form to contact the AAUW-PA Program VP and send a copy to the Finance Officer. Branches may request a specific person, but final decisions will be based on topic expertise, availability, and proximity to the host branch.

You will be contacted regarding the arrangements. Publicity information will be emailed to you when your application is approved.

Add your AAUW-PA Leader on Loan to your Branch Calendar and have a wonderful event!

Remember to send the evaluation form, found on the website, to the Program VP within 30 days of the event.

Leader requests are approved on a first-requested, first-assigned basis, while budgeted funds remain available. Please make your request at least two months in advance.
